### Message from the Chief Academic Officer

#### Dear HPA Families,

Did you know that HPA is a top performing school in the far northeast? Our elementary school students out perform their peers in all of the neighboring schools, and our middle school is one of the top three high performing middle schools in the far northeast region. High Point Academy is also outperforming DPS (Denver Public School District) and APS (Aurora Public School District) in reading and writing, as shown by the 2013-2014 TCAP state assessment results. While we know that you choose to send your child to HPA because of our dedicated teachers, engaging and challenging curriculum, we know that this achievement data is another compelling reason you believe in HPA.

This year we continue to see growth and learning and we are excited by the growth our students are making. One measure of growth that we watch and measure each quarter is our STAR data. Prior to the first day of school, you may remember, our students took the STAR reading and math assessment. The assessment results provided teachers important information so that they could plan lessons that were directly aligned to students' needs. Having this data was extremely helpful in providing targeted instruction from the first day of school. The STAR reading and math tests were administered at the end of first quarter. The results were very positive and we saw growth across every content area and grade level. The strong growth is a product of our students' hard work, the support and partnership of our families, and the commitment and passion for teaching and learning that our teachers provide each day.

Of course none of this would be possible without the wonderful faculty and staff at HPA. The staff work tirelessly to create a tremendous learning environment for our students. Let me share with you a few of the engaging and compelling learning experiences that took place this fall.

Our eighth graders completed a unit of study called, "Designing the Future." Students learned about different inventions and how innovation shaped society during that time period. They were reading the book, <u>The Giver</u>, which provocatively discusses those ideas. Sixth graders designed ecosystem books for children. They were our resident experts when they presented their books to our fourth graders. The fourth graders fine-tuned their research and writing skills when they created their own "Decade Magazine" that reported major events of that time period. Our younger readers and writers in first, second, and third grade conducted author studies, character studies, and developed their 'how to' and 'persuasive' writing skills. Kindergartners developed their scientific skills and explored the power of our five senses.

Our hallways have been adorned with the beautiful art work our middle school students completed first and second quarter. As you may know, this school year HPA launched Art as one of our Specials offering. Students in Kindergarten through eighth grade participate in our art class. Students continue to develop their drawing, painting, and creative design skills. HPA believes strongly in our students' ability to think creatively and problem-solve, both critical skills for 21<sup>st</sup> century success. With the addition of art to the other wonderful specials (Wellness, Media-Technology, Spanish, and Physical Education) at HPA we are thrilled that our students are given the opportunity to think and develop in new and exciting ways.

As a staff, we are proud of the accomplishments your students have made this semester. The first half of the year was filled with achievement and growth as well as laughter and community. I wish everyone in the HPA community a safe and happy holiday season and I look forward to the New Year and what 2015 will bring.
