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Message from the Chief Academic Officer

Dear HPA families,

We had a very exciting day today! It was the culmination of a yearlong partnership between High Point Academy Kindergartners and 5th graders from Denver Jewish Day School. Through a collaborative experience, our very own Kindergartners shared their knowledge and expertise of health and wellness with the 5th graders; who in return, raised money to buy each of our students a bicycle. You may be able to capture this heartfelt story of students helping students on the news this afternoon. We are so grateful to our Kindergarten team – Mrs. Gichuru, Mrs. Faulkenburg, Ms. O'Connor, Mrs. Mattern, Ms. Lord, Mr. Basnight for all their work this year to make this experience possible.

We recently conducted our annual Family Satisfaction Survey. At HPA, we truly value your input and continue to find ways to create a school culture that values the voices of all our stakeholders (students, parents, staff, board members), thus the Family Satisfaction Survey is one tool we use to gather this critical data. This year we had approximately 50% of our families complete the survey. We wanted to thank all of those families that were able to take the survey and provide your feedback. We (staff, administration and our governing board) have reviewed your feedback carefully. Here are a few highlights.

94% of families believe HPA provides a strong foundation of academic excellence and 92% of our families would recommend HPA to family or friends.

94% of families feel welcome when they visit HPA and 95% of families believe that HPA respects the different cultures that are represented in the school community.

We also ask families why they choose HPA for their children. The top four reasons families attend HPA are: stronger curriculum, the school's educational philosophy, teacher quality, and that we are an independent charter.

Another area where we ask for feedback is regarding our preschool, elementary, and middle school programming.

100% of our preschool families are satisfied with what their student is learning in preschool and believe that our preschool program is preparing their student for kindergarten. 92% of families believe that our preschool classrooms are well equipped to meet their child's needs.

92% of our elementary school families stated that they are satisfied with what their child is learning in their core subjects, and 90% agree or strongly agree that each core subject is preparing their student for the next academic level.

90% of our middle school families stated that they are satisfied with what their child is learning in each content area, 90% agree or strongly agree that each core subject is preparing their child for the next academic level.
