These celebrations of learning are one of the many attributes that set High Point Academy apart from other schools. Our students prepare to share their learning by reflecting on what they've accomplished as readers, writers, scientists, and mathematicians. For many students this is the first time they have prepared and given a presentation; and for many it is powerful to see how far they have come this school year. Preparing, presenting, and thinking in these ways build skills our students need in the 21st century.
