Much like the rest of the world, at High Point Academy, staff was closely watching the trial of Derek Chauvin. The news on Tuesday that Derek Chauvin will be held accountable for the murder of George Floyd is a verdict that members of our community have been waiting for too long and it is a sign that their lives matter.

Though this is a long overdue step toward accountability, we stand with our Black and Brown community and say that we will continue to do our part to create a more just world. At HPA, we will continue to reflect on the ways our system is persisting injustice and we will continue to work to ensure that every student is known, their unique abilities are celebrated, and that our campus is a safe learning environment for all students to grow and thrive.





Traffic Control at 64th Ave. and Dunkirk St.

HPA works with Aurora Police Department to find off duty police officers who would like to work traffic control at the intersection of 64th Ave. & Dunkirk St.

At this time there is only 1 officer who has accepted the job. Officer Johnny Lee works on Mondays AM & PM

We have reached out to Denver Police Department for any interested officers, none have responded

Due to city/insurance regulations, we aren't allowed to hire parents to do traffic control

64th and Dunkirk Traffic Signal Update

The signal at 64th Ave and Dunkirk has been selected to receive funding in 2021. It is one of 4 signals out of 23 warranted signals to receive funding.

The signal now moves into design.

It is anticipated that construction will begin in 2022.

This signal requires coordination with the developer on the southwest corner to complete the civil work on that corner. Signal projects normally take 1-3 years for design and construction.


