A Message from Executive Director/Principal, Keri Melmed

Dear HPA Families,

As we settle back to school routines, we know that you want to support your child's learning and growth. Here are a few important reminders that will support your child's smooth transition:

COVID: To help keep HPA as healthy as possible – keep your child at home if they have symptoms associated with COVID-19 and/or if they have come into contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, or if they are just not feeling well. Please ensure that your child has a mask and that they can wear it properly on their face – covering both their nose and mouth.



Colder Weather: To ensure our students are active – bring warm jackets, hats, and shoes every day. We have outside recess when temperatures are 25 degrees or higher. We want our students outside in the fresh air and running around as much as possible.

Cellphones: To maintain a strong learning environment – keep cell phones at home. If your child brings a cell phone to school – remember HPA cell phone policy states that cell phones must be placed in lockers (6th-8th) and given to homeroom teachers (K-5) for the duration of the school day. Students cannot have their cell phones on them during school. You can find the entire electronics policy here: <https://www.highpointacademy.net/handbooks/>

Dress Code: As a student at HPA, your child is required to follow dress code and come to school in appropriate clothes every day. Dress code de-emphasizes clothing and there is less pressure to keep up with expensive trends and fashion, reduces social conflict and peer pressure that can be associated with appearance, imposes boundaries on the type of clothing students can wear as they navigate adolescence – a time when student bodies are changing, and students may feel more vulnerable about how they look. We know that students are eager to have a choice and express themselves and we provide opportunities for this on our dress-down days. HPA's entire dress code policy can be found here: <https://www.highpointacademy.net/dress-code/> Starting the week of January 24th, if your child is out of dress code families will be required to bring their child a change of clothing. We have some shirts and pants in our clinic, please reach out to our clinic assistant Emily Chouinard for that resource at echouinard@highpointacademy.net

Recess: We ask that you have conversations with your students about the recess expectations at High Point Academy. Expectations are as follows: (1) Students are expected to be cooperative, kind and inclusive. (2) Report any concerns to an adult. (3) Respect the personal space of others. When playing any sports: no tackling, rough housing or physical contact. (4) Use care with recess equipment and climbing spaces. (5) Follow all directions and recess expectations. Sleep: Ensure a consistent bedtime. Children 4-14 years old should be getting 8-10 hours of sleep each night. Remove cell phones, video games, and other technology so that those items do not keep your child from getting the sleep they need for optimal development.

Concerns: If you have a concern, please reach out to your child's teacher. Your child's teacher or advisor is your first point of contact. If you have general questions, please email info@highpointacademy.net

Community courtesies: Practice HPA community courtesies. Allow 36 hour response time for each email, call or request. Be respectful with your interactions and remember that we are all doing and trying our best.

*Inclement weather- below 25°, high winds, rain, or snow between 2:30-4:00.

For the safety of all, School Policy requires that families stay in their vehicles during arrival/dismissal.

However, for those who wish to park and stand in line to pick up their student(s) during inclement weather, please note:

- 3:15 **Carpool Dismissal** to the East of the Wellness Doors (see green arrow)
- 3:30 **Walkers Dismissed** thru Front Doors of the School. Parents can call ahead to inform if student should go to carpool instead.
- 3:45 **Parked Pick Up** to the West of the Wellness Doors (see red arrow)
- 4:00 Late Pick Ups at the front of the school, late fees will apply

Please respect the handicap parking spaces. Only clearly marked handicapped vehicles may use these spaces.

We are working hard with the Aurora and Denver Police to hire an off-duty police officer to assist with traffic control at the intersection of 64th and Dunkirk.

Vaccination Deliberation: Learn About the COVID-19 Vaccines

You have questions, and that's OK. We've tracked down the answers to common questions about the COVID-19 vaccines. Wherever you are on your journey, knowing the facts can help.

Updates From Tri-County Health Department:

Masks: The public health order requiring masks in all indoor public spaces in Adams and Arapahoe Counties will remain in place at least through January. All individuals 2 years of age and older, regardless of vaccination status, should wear a mask.

Vaccines: Vaccines remain the safest, most effective way to slow the spread of COVID-19 and its variants, and to help avoid the worst outcomes among those who do become infected. The COVID-19 vaccine is free. You don't need an ID or insurance to get vaccinated. Make sure you are up-to-date on your vaccine! There are more than 1000 [vaccine providers](#) in CO from pharmacies to community clinics, [find a site today](#).

Testing: CDC recommends testing on day 5 after exposure or immediately if symptoms develop. There are over 150 free community [testing sites](#) across Colorado. Community testing sites are still experiencing high demand. You are encouraged to make an appointment or pre-register to avoid long wait times. The state has updated its rapid at-home testing program. [Order tests](#), free of charge, to be shipped directly to your home. Because of the increased demand it may take 2 weeks to get your order.

Isolation: Everyone, regardless of vaccination status must stay at home in isolation and avoid contact with others for at least 5 days if you tested positive for COVID-19 or have symptoms. You can leave your home after 5 days if you have no symptoms, or your symptoms are resolving after 5 days and if you are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medications). Continue to wear a well-fitting mask when around others for an additional 5 days.

Quarantine: For those who have been exposed to COVID-19, stay home and away from people for at least five days after your last close contact if you are not vaccinated, or have not completed your primary vaccine series, or are 18+ and have not received a booster. Wear a well-fitted mask when around others at home. Get tested even if you don't develop symptoms at least five days after you last had contact with someone with COVID-19. For 10 days, watch for fever (100.4 or greater), cough, shortness of breath, or other COVID-19 symptoms. If you develop symptoms, get tested immediately and isolate until you receive your test results.
