Dear caregivers, parents, and families:

Before school lets out I wanted to tell you about Denver Public Library's Summer of Adventure program, which encourages youth from birth to 12th grade to grow, learn and have fun while school is out. Best of all, it's FREE!

During the last couple of years, young people have experienced loss in social connections and academic learning. Over the summer months, while not in school, students who lack access to learning opportunities also lose anywhere between 1-3 months of reading and math skills. This is referred to as the summer slide or summer learning loss.

It's more important than ever for youth to experience connection, growth and fun. Summer of Adventure provides youth with opportunities for self-paced informal learning and activities to help them retain academic and social skills during the summer months.
