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<u>Assessment Information and Time</u>

IREADY- i-Ready is an online program for reading and/or mathematics that will help your student's teacher(s) determine your student's needs, personalize their learning, and monitor progress throughout the school year. i-Ready allows your teacher(s) to meet your student exactly where they are and provides data to increase your student's learning gains. i-Ready consists of two parts: Diagnostic and Personalized Instruction.

Dibels-Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills- Dibels is a set of procedures and measures for assessing the acquisition of literacy skills. They are designed to be short (one minute) fluency measures that can be used to regularly detect risk and monitor the development of early literacy and early reading skills in kindergarten through eighth grade. All kindergarten through 3rd grade students will be given the Dibels assessment, along with some 4th-8th graders as necessary.

ANet (Achievement Network) Interim Assessments - Anet assessments are computer-based, formative assessments that measure students' progress towards grade level standards. Anet provides timely, actionable, and student specific information that will help teachers determine which standards students have mastered and which standards students need to continue to work on in order to help guide instruction in the classroom.

W-APT – WIDA (World-Class Instructional Design and Assessment)-ACCESS Placement Test that is given to all English Language Learners (ELLs) that are new to High Point. It is a paper-based assessment given in both individual and group settings to assess students' ability to listen, speak, read and write English. This assessment is given to ELL students new to the school within the first 30 days of entrance. For kindergarteners, it takes approximately 15 minutes to complete. For the rest of the grade levels, the testing times vary and are approximately 1 hour 15 minutes for $1^{st} - 5^{th}$, and approximately 1 hour 30 minutes for $6^{th} - 8^{th}$.

ACCESS for ELLs – Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Language Learners. This assessment is given once per year to all new and returning ELL students that are non-English proficient (NEP) and limited English proficient (LEP). For kindergarten students, the assessment takes approximately one hour. For grades 1 – 8 there are four, forty-five minute sessions.

NNAT3 – Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test – second edition. All 2^{nd} and 6^{th} grade students at High Point are given the NNAT2 to screen for giftedness. Additionally, students are assessed by recommendation only. The NNAT2 is a 30-minute online assessment.



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CMAS- Colorado Measures of Academic Success are the state of Colorado's English language arts (ELA), math, science, and social studies tests to measure student mastery of the new Colorado academic standards in grades 3 – 8. All 5th and 8th graders will take science. Social Studies tests are administered to students in grades 4 and 7 every 3 years.

Teaching Strategies Gold (TSG) – This assessment is mandated by the state of Colorado to ensure school readiness and is only administered to kindergarten students and preschool-aged students. The assessment is completed within the first 60 days of school. Students don't take a test; teachers track student evidence of academic, social, and emotional benchmarks and record them in the system.
